## FINANCIAL AID &SCHOLARSHIPS

#### FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

- FAFSA is projected to fully debut for 2025-2026 on Dec. 1, 2024.
- Must be completed by June 30th.
- FAFSA Night at MSM is Nov 6th, 6-8pm.
- Applications must be completed online: www.fafsa.gov/
- Create a FSA ID for FAFSA.
- · Parents' tax return needed for filing.
- For students applying to NYS schools, the TAP (Tuition Assistance Program) form is included in FAFSA app.
- Does your school require a CSS profile?
   \*College Board has a list of institutions that participate.
- Many schools will not award scholarships/grants without a FAFSA/CSS profile.

### **Scholarships**

- Local/WNY Scholarships can be found on MSM's Google Sheet in the Class of 2025 Google Classroom.
- Check often for latest updates!
- Connect with college on college related scholarships.
- Use Going Merry to search and apply for private scholarships.
- All outside (of college) scholarships
   MUST be reported to your chosen
   school. Schools may adjust your financial
   aid package.

# COLLEGE APPLICATION \*\*

Goal: Submit college applications by Thanksgiving or two weeks before deadlines.

#### EARLY DECISION VS. EARLY ACTION

- <u>Early decision</u> (ED) commitments are binding. A student who accepts as an ED applicant must attend the college.
- <u>Early action (EA)</u> plans are nonbinding.
   Students receive an early response to their application, but do not have to commit to the college.
- Regular Decision deadlines are usually btwn. 1/1-1/15, these are the most common application type.
- Rolling admissions colleges receive and release decisions as they become available.

## **TRANSCRIPTS**

- If you are applying through Common App or SUNY App, your counselor will be notified to send your transcript.
- Please notify your counselor if you are applying through a specific school's website.
- You must self-report all classes and grades via SRAR (Self-Reported Academic Record).



Have you taken a dual enrollment class? Se sure to send your college transcript to your chosen school once you accept!
Links are on Google Classroom for each dual-enrollment school. MSM does not have access to college transcripts.



- Through Common App, you will invite and assign your recommenders who will be notified via email.
- Your counselor will provide an additional letter.

## START HERE

For the College planning process!

#### STEP #1 - APPLICATION

- Create your Common App account and fill out the application.
- A good goal is to have a narroweddown list of at least 5-8 schools you are applying to.

#### STEP #2 - LETTERS OF REC

- Most colleges require 1-2 letters of recommendation from teachers. We recommend asking junior-year teachers who have known you most recently.
- Please give teachers at least 1-2 weeks and please ask teachers in person.
  - Some colleges accept employer or coach letters of rec.



## STEP #6 - VISITS/INTERVIEWS

- Schedule through Office of Admissions.
- Bring a copy of your unofficial transcript & resume.
- It may be good to also meet with Financial Aid reps or a faculty member from your intended program.
- Be early and dress comfortably but professionally.
- Interviewers are looking for your passion, energy, commitment, and values.
- Send a follow up thank you note!



## STEP #3 - SAT/ACT

- Consider taking at least one of these exams and prepare in advance.
- Check fairtest.org for schools that are testoptional.
- See Collegeboard.org for test dates, deadlines, registration for tests, or to have scores sent to colleges.

## Be sure to include: STEP #5 - RESUME

Contact info

- Education (MSM, expected grad date)
- Jobs (w/ dates worked, position, location)
- Community service work (w/ org. name)
- Awards
- Sports or any other activities grades 9-12

#### STEP #4 - COLLEGE ESSAY

- Think specific & insightful, not necessarily big & life-changing.
- Show a story arc.
- Reveal an aspect of you that may not appear anywhere else in your application.
