

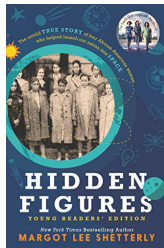
## Summer Reading Lists - 2024-2025

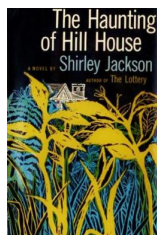

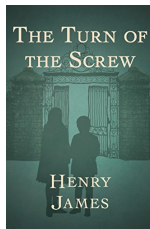
