

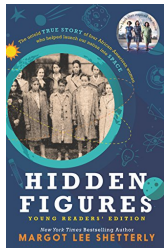
Summer Reading Lists - 2025-2026

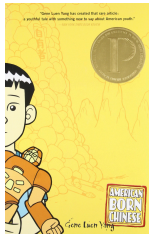

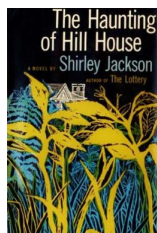

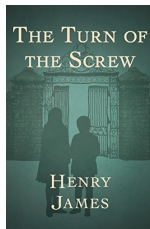

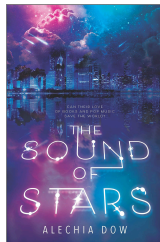
